Morning Drop-Off

All students must be dropped off in the front drop-off loop.

To avoid a citation, do not park your car in the empty lot in front of the school and walk your child to school as it is private property. Our neighbors have asked that you not

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park on the streets in front of their houses, especially in front of their driveway or vacant lot. We have been advised that the Cape Coral Police Department will periodically check for violators and issue warnings and/or citations for repeat violations. If you feel the need to park, park in a designated parking spot in the school parking lot.

Please do not drop off your child(ren) across the street or at the school BEFORE 8:25 am as staff will not be on duty until 8:25 am.

The "Rainy Day" dismissal will occur during a rainy day/lightning warning notice (within 10 miles). This will delay our dismissal time. Thank you in advance for helping us keep your child safe.

Parents who do not have a parent pick-up tag must park in a designated parking spot, enter the front lobby and show identification. Your child's safety is our #1 priority. We appreciate your assistance and cooperation in maintaining a safe campus for all of our children.

The students and staff of your school will be practicing emergency drills each month. They are "Fire/Evacuation Drill"; "Lockdown/Lock-out".

<u>Fire/Evacuation Drill:</u> The school will conduct a "fire drill" each month that the school is in session. This is a Fire Code requirement as well as a requirement for all Lee County schools. We want each student to understand and be aware of the importance of this drill and not be afraid when the fire alarm is sounded. By practicing they will know what to do and how to do it.

<u>Lockdown/Shelter-in-place</u>: A Lockdown or Shelter-in-Place Drill will be held each month. This type of drill will secure the school building and safely shelter all students, staff, and visitors inside the building. The purpose of this drill is to keep the students safe from any danger outside or inside the building. To enable everyone to remain safe, no one will be allowed to enter the building or leave the building until the drill is completed.
